1 Corinthians 13

13 Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. ² And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³ And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing.

⁴ Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; ⁵does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; ⁶ does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; ⁷ bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. NKJV



Definitions & Biblical References

Patient

the capacity to accept or tolerate delay, trouble, or suffering without getting angry or upset.

Jesus exemplified patience

"Though absolutely unyielding in adherence to the truth, He exemplified patience repeatedly during His mortal ministry. He was patient with His disciples, including the Twelve, despite their lack of faith and their slowness to recognize and understand His divine mission. He was patient with the multitudes as they pressed about Him, with the woman taken in sin, with those who sought His healing power, and with little children. Finally, He remained patient through the sufferings of His mock trials and His crucifixion." (Church News 10 May 1997)

Kind

of a sympathetic or helpful nature

Jesus exemplified kindness

Kindness requires a seeking out, a looking for the needs of others...Crowds followed Him and traveled miles just to hear him speak. Healing the sick, feeding the hungry, teaching the people, caring for the widow, and defending children, Jesus lived 33 years of perfect kindness. He is not asking any more of us than what He willingly practiced himself. (Geneva.edu 17 Feb 2019)

Pride

having or showing a high or excessively high opinion of oneself or one's importance

Examples

The statement "Happy Wife, Happy Life" is a great example of a common saying that, at it's roots, can have it's sentiment based in pride, especially when stated by the wife in a sincere manner...

Or, a man who believes his position is superior because of scripture





Definitions & Biblical References

Envy (Jealous)

feeling or showing envy of someone or their achievements and advantages

Boast

showing excessive pride and selfsatisfaction in one's achievements, possessions, or abilities

Rude

offensively impolite or ill-mannered; having a startling abruptness

Self-seeking

seeking only to further one's own interests

Provoked (Some versions have "Irritable")

Incited to anger; having or showing a tendency to be easily annoyed or made angry

Record

the sum of the past achievements or actions of a person or organization; a person or thing's previous conduct or performance

Does Not Delight In Evil

a high degree of gratification or pleasure

Bears

something difficult to do or deal with

Believes

to accept the word or evidence of; or, In the Greek; to have faith

Hope

to desire with expectation of obtainment or fulfillment

Perserveres

to persist in a state, enterprise, or undertaking in spite of counterinfluences, opposition, or discouragement


